



Background and APN





The position of damages actuaries

- Calculation of special (quantifiable) damages
- Instructed by plaintiff or defendant
- No syllabus or core reading
- Not a statutory/reserved role
- Unregulated area
- Governed by common law (precedent)
- Expert witness (duty to Court)
- Attorney appointed (duty to client)





Damages Committee and APN

- Damages and Compensation Committee established July 2014.
- Sub-committees deal with
 - Professional Guidance
 - Research
 - CPD & Awareness
 - Legal updates
- APN close to finalisation but still requires PMB approval


